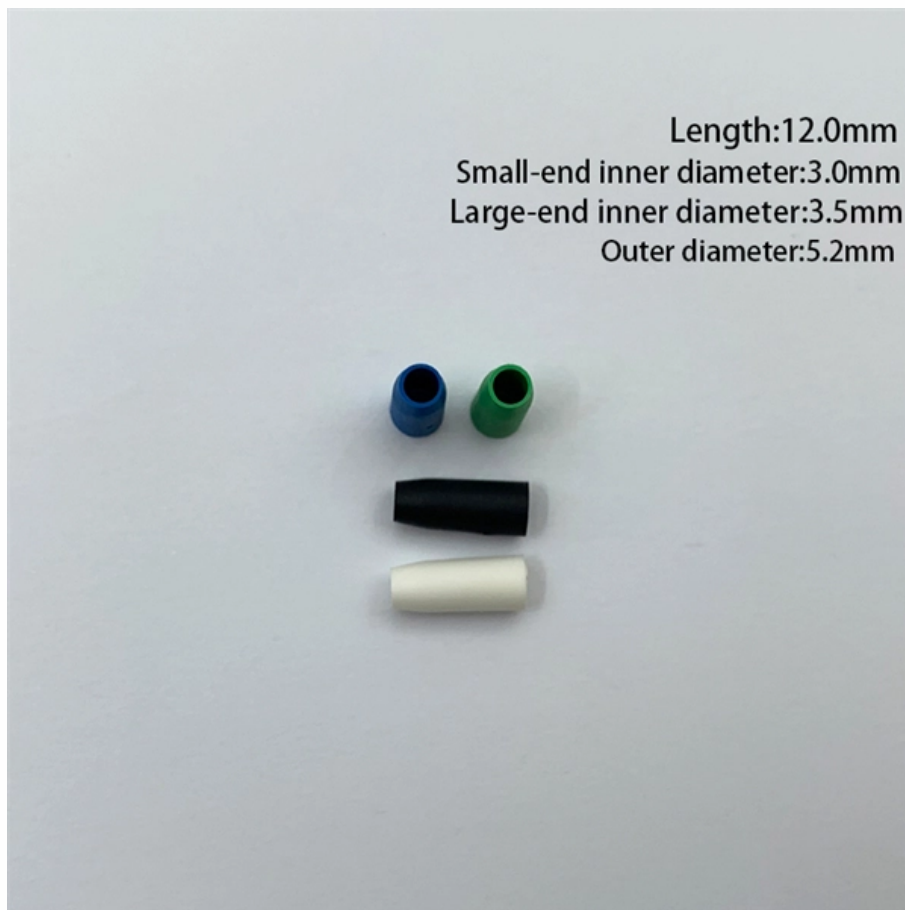

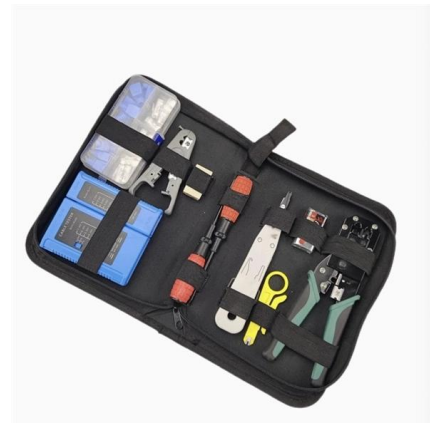

ALL-DIELECTRIC SELF-SUPPORTING OPTICAL CABLE (ADSS)

Loose-tube cable, a gel-filled multi-tube cable, typically double-sheathed, separated by aramid or fiberglass strands, which provides ballistic protection to the cable, giving it greater robustness.

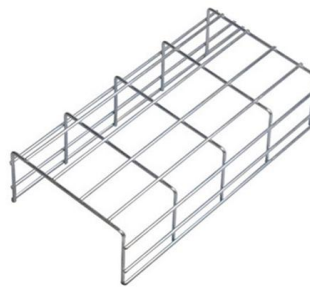

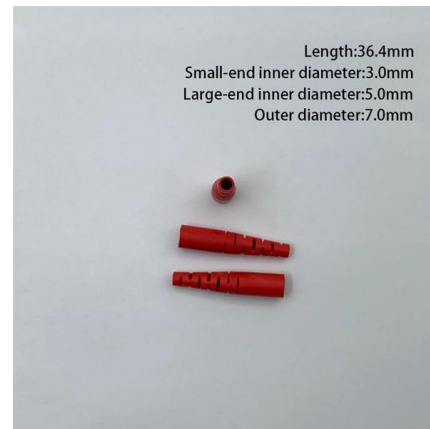

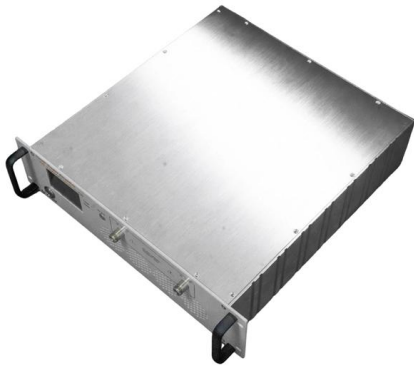
