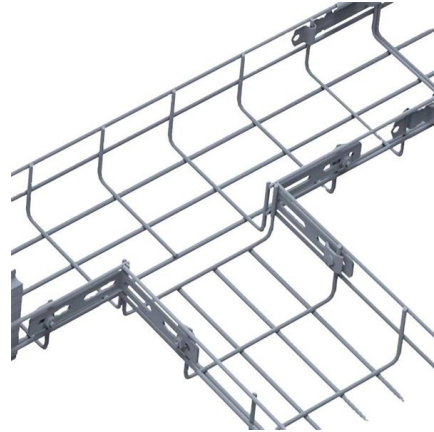

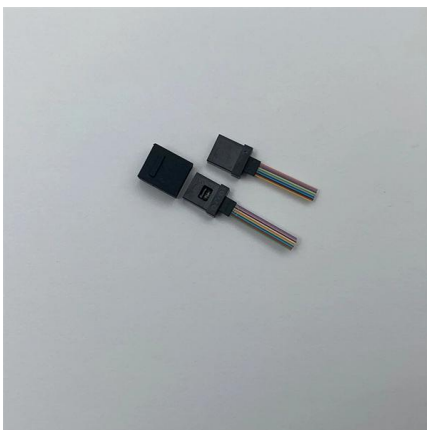


Essential Rules for 3-Level Electrical Distribution

Follow key principles: no cross-level wiring, one machine-one switch, $\leq 30\text{m}$ box spacing, dry/ventilated installation for safe distribution.

Tertiary Distribution System: Connects to end-use equipment via switch boxes, forming a three-tier power distribution system. Incorporates a "two-tier protection" strategy: Residual current devices



What is Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 distribution box

Three level distribution refers to the general distribution box, distribution box, switch box. Two-level protection refers to the leakage protection of the main distribution box and switch box.
