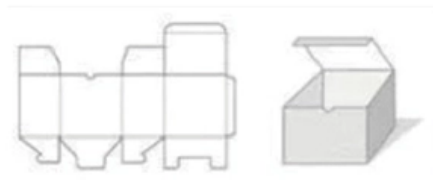

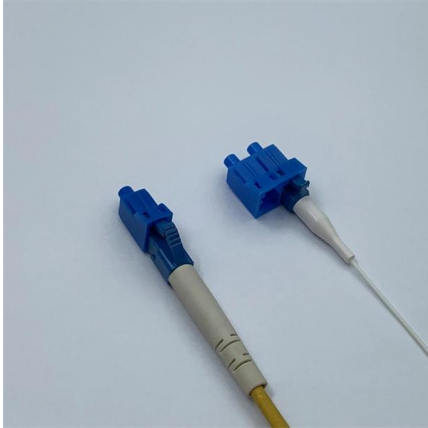

No. That's a terrible idea. There's a reason you never hear of anyone doing this. The cable isn't likely rated for the load of 4 switches. Plus if someone does accidentally unplug it it disconnects 4

If one power supply fails, the other immediately can carry the total power load of the switch without powering down any modules. By default, a switch is configured for redundant mode. If

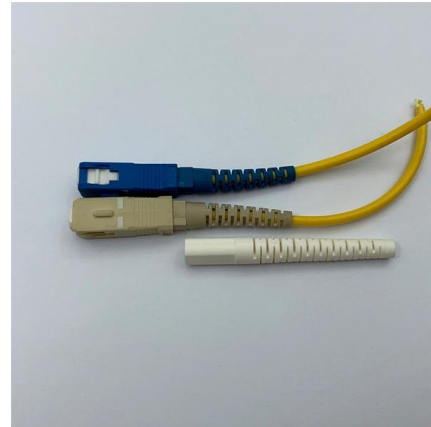

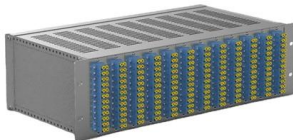
Power Supply Redundancy In Core Switch

In contrast, a linear power supply regulates the output voltage by continually dissipating power in the pass transistor. The switched-mode power supply's



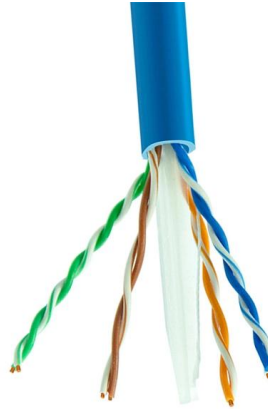
What is a Core Switch?

Core issue All power supply status LEDs should be green. The power supply includes the power supplies and power supply fans. If one or both are red, this can indicate a power supply



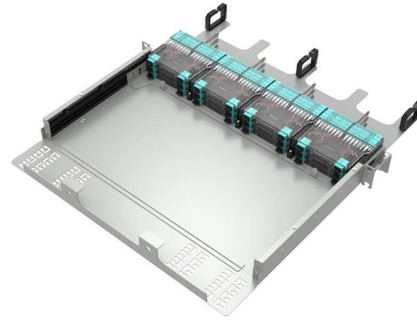
