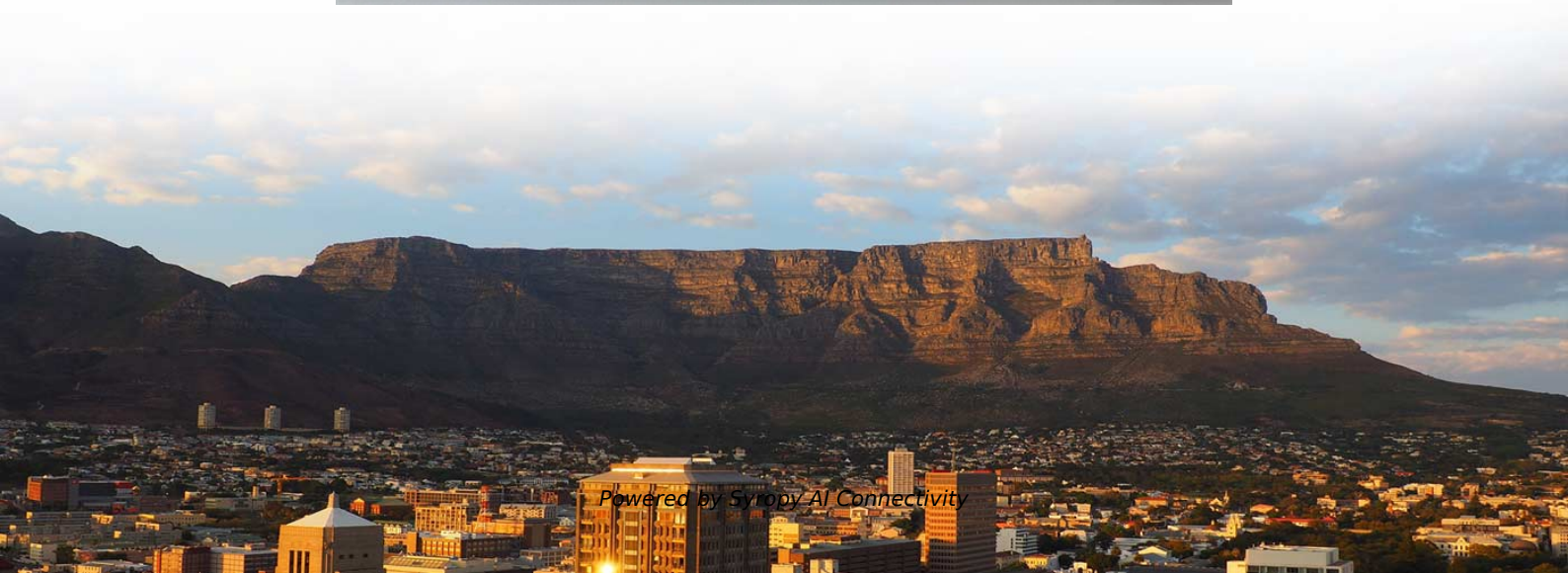


# **Loose fiber optic cable inside drop cable**

Flat drop fiber optic cable is famous for its flat appearance, usually made of polyethylene (PE) sheath, loose tube with optical fiber inside, and two FRP strength members to provide high tensile and compressive resistance. It creates the critical link between the distribution cable terminal (such as a Fiber Access Terminal or FAT box) and the subscriber's premises (connecting to an Optical Network Unit or ONU).
